Between 2025 and 2027, thirteen partners from Belgium, the Netherlands and Germany will join forces in VIA VIA: a cross-border project that brings Roman heritage in the Meuse Rhine region to life. Visitors will embark on a unique journey past nine Roman sites spread across Maastricht, Tongeren, Tienen, Voerendaal, Jülich and Aachen, among other places. Museums such as the Gallo-Roman Museum, Museum Zitadelle and Centre Céramique are also involved, as are the universities of Utrecht and Liège.

VIA VIA stimulates entrepreneurship by involving local entrepreneurs. They translate the Roman stories into regional products, handmade souvenirs and culinary experiences. This creates economic opportunities and allows history to be experienced in a contemporary way.
